Organizers and Location


The Championships will be organized by the National Association of Rocketry in partnership with the Academy of Model Aeronautics.

The competition field for the World Championships will be located at the Apache Pass Event Center Airport, west-northwest of Rockdale, TX. The range and recovery area will cover approximately 500 acres (200 hectares). GPS coordinates for the field are 30°40'49.8"N 97°08'33.4"W (30.680505, -97.142596).

The primary housing location for competitors and team supporters will be in student housing located on the campus of Southwestern University in Georgetown, Texas, approximately 34 miles (55km) from the flying site. Cafeteria-style breakfast and dinner choices will be available for participants who choose this housing option. Participants who prefer more traditional hotel arrangements will have the opportunity to choose from many options offering a wide range of amenities and prices.



Overview of flying site



The housing and competition sites are separated by 35 miles/56km of lightly traveled roads.

Competition Classes

Seniors: S1B (two stage), S3A, S4A, S5C, S6A, S7, S8P, S9A, S2/P
Juniors: S1A (single stage), S3A, S4A, S5B, S6A, S7, S8D, S9A, S2/P

Senior and Junior S2/P will be contested as Open International Cup events.

Rules and Safety Code

The Championships will be administered according to the FAI Sporting Code, Section 4 CIAM General Rules (2023 Edition) and Section 4 Volume S, Space Models (2023 Edition). The FAI General Section and FAI Code of Ethics will also apply.

All flight operations at this event will be conducted according to the FAI Space Model Safety Code (FAI Sporting Code, Section 4, Aeromodelling, Volume S, Space Models, Annex 5) and the National Association of Rocketry Model Rocket Safety Code.

Anti-Doping Statement

If a competitor has to take, by a medical condition, any of the substances listed on the WADA Prohibited List then he must have a Therapeutic Use Exemption from the FAI. www.wada-ama.org
Statement from the FAI anti-doping regulations: "If you regularly take medication prescribed by your doctor and this medication is on the WADA prohibited list, you need to get a form called a TUE (therapeutic use exemption) filled out by your doctor. International level athletes must send the form to the FAI Secretariat, national level athletes send it to their National Air Sport Control."

FAI Sporting License

Each competitor and Team Manager must possess an FAI Sporting License valid for the year of the Championship. This license must be registered in the FAI licenses database. The holder of an FAI Sporting License may be required to produce an official document bearing their photograph and signature as proof of identity.

Protests

Any protests must be presented in writing to the Contest Director and must be accompanied by the deposit of a fee of €50 (or equivalent USD amount). The deposit shall be returned only if the protest is upheld.

Official Language

English

Measurement of Flight Altitudes

Adrel Altimeters will be used to measure altitudes in classes S1A, S1B, S5C, S5B, and S2/P. The organizer shall provide electronic altimeters for all entrants in these classes. Every team shall submit a €100 (or equivalent USD amount) deposit for each altimeter that will be issued. This deposit must be paid prior to the competitor's first flight in each event, and will be returned following the event when each altimeter and battery is returned. If an altimeter or battery is not returned or is damaged the deposit will be retained by the organizer. If an altimeter or battery is lost during the competition, a new deposit must be paid to allow the competitor to continue participating in the competition.

Motors

All motors used in this Championship must be legal and certified for use, transport, and sale in the United States. To simplify the challenges traditionally associated with motor transport to space modeling events, the organizers will provide all motors to be used by competitors at this World Championships, as allowed by Rule 3.10.3 of the Space Models Sporting Code. By removing the burden of motor transport from the participating teams, this will be an exciting, efficient, equitable, and safe event. Only motors provided by the organizers may be used at this Championships.

Motors will be tested well in advance of the event, with testing data provided to all participating teams in accordance with Rule 3.10.1 of the Space Models Sporting Code. Additional information concerning the motors to be used at this Championship may be found in the Motor Information Appendix accompanying this Bulletin.

Motors for S1, S3, S4, S5, S6, and S9 will be available on the flying field at no cost to competitors for both practice and competition. An order form for motors to be used in S7, S8, and S2/P is distributed with this Bulletin. Please submit payment for any needed S2/P, S7, and S8 motors with your registration payment.

Dethermalizers

Due to the high risk of fire, dethermalizers that use burning or smoldering media (such as fuse dethermalizers) may not be used. Electronic timer-based and radio actuated dethermalizers are permissible. *Please contact the Contest Director if you have any questions concerning the appropriateness of your dethermalizer for this contest!*

Special UAS Information Concerning Regulations for S8D and S8P Flyers

The United States has very specific requirements for individuals flying UAS aircraft (Unmanned Aircraft Systems), such as radio control aircraft. Non-US citizens are required to follow the same model aircraft regulations that US citizens are required to follow, including following AMA safety guidelines, registering at [FAA's Drone Zone](#), and taking [The Recreational UAS Safety Test \(TRUST\)](#). A portal has been established through the World Championship website (nar.org/championships) to assist competitors and team managers in complying with these regulations prior to arriving in the US.

A waiver to Section 44809 §(a)(6) of the Federal Aviation Regulations allowing S8 flights up to 1,200' AGL has been secured with the assistance of the Academy of Model Aeronautics.

Launch Rails

A limited number of 6'/1.8m rail launchers will be available for use by teams for the S2/P event on a shared basis. Rail guides (rail buttons) will be available on the field for participating contestants.

Composition of a National Team

Each National Aero Club or National Federation that is a member of the FAI and CIAM may enter a team consisting of the following:

- * Senior Team Manager
- * Senior Team Manager Assistant
- * Senior Competitors
 - * In each class a maximum of three competitors, or a maximum of four competitors if at least one competitor is female.
- * Junior Team Manager
- * Junior Team Manager Assistant
- * Junior Competitors
 - * In each class a maximum of three competitors, or a maximum of four competitors if at least one competitor is female.
- * The reigning Senior and Junior World Champions
- * Official helpers and supporters
- * Each National Team may bring one timekeeper who will be provided housing and board free of charge

Classification and Awards - Individual

FAI Medals and Diplomas and National Association of Rocketry medals will be awarded to individual Senior and Junior competitors placing first, second, and third in each event.

All Senior Females will compete for the overall Senior individual classification in each class. Additionally, there is a Senior Female classification in each class with FAI Medals and Diplomas.

All Junior Females will compete for the overall Junior individual classification in each class. Additionally, there is a Junior Female classification in each class with FAI Medals and Diplomas.

With the approval of their National Aero Club the reigning World Champion from 2021 in each class is eligible to participate regardless of whether or not they qualify for their national team. If they are not a member of their national team, their score will not be considered in the team results.

Visa and Immigration Information and Support

Please read this section carefully. Any participant coming from outside the United States will need to complete ONE of these two important steps before traveling:

1) **You must hold a visa to travel to the United States,**

OR

2) **Hold a passport from a country that participates in the Visa Waiver Program and complete the Electronic System for Travel Authorization**

All travelers using the Visa Waiver Program (VWP) will also need to complete an Electronic System for Travel Authorization application (ESTA). This is a simple online application, and should be completed no less than 72 hours before your departure for the US. More information may be found at: <https://esta.cbp.dhs.gov/esta>

Invitation letters for participants requiring a visa will be available. Those needing a visa letter should request one by contacting their team manager, who may request these through the organizers.

Registration of National Teams

This process is to be used for both the World Championships and the S2/P Open International event! Registration for National Teams is now open, and will be completed by Team Managers and their National Aero Clubs using the eNavigator contest management platform. To register, Team Managers should visit the eNavigator website at: <https://2023-wchsm.enavigator.org/applications>

Begin by creating an account using the “Sign Up” link at the bottom middle of the page. Once signed in as an authorized user of the eNavigator tool, Team Managers should begin the registration process. When all participants have been entered the eNavigator tool will present a “Submit” button. The tool will even generate a payment amount for each team using the “Payment and Options” button.

It is vitally important that *ONLY* Team Managers should enter data into the eNavigator tool. If individual competitors have questions about the registration process they should consult with their Team Manager. Upon arrival at registration each Team Manager should present FAI Licenses for team participants, an updated entry form (if any changes have been made from the preliminary entry form), a national flag (3' x 5'/1m x 1.5m), and their national anthem on a USB thumb drive.

On-site Registration Procedure

Team Registration will open at 11 AM on Saturday, July 1, in the Robertson Center on the Southwestern University campus.

- 1) Managers will begin the process by registering their team, verifying payment of all fees, and receiving team credentials. Participants will each be issued a “swag bag” with an event T-shirt.
- 2) All dorm residents must be present for housing registration. Southwestern University staff will complete registration and place a wristband on each dorm resident. This wristband will act as a meal ticket for all breakfast and dinner dining on campus at the University. Each dorm resident will be asked to sign a waiver during the registration process (available on the ‘Bulletins’ tab of the event website).
- 3) Keys will be issued to dorm residents by SU staff. Please note the charges that will be assessed for any lost key. Most dorms will use key cards, while certain dorms will have physical keys. Lost key cards will be \$20, while lost physical keys will be \$100. *Don't lose your key!*
- 4) Each dorm resident will be issued a bedding package that contains sheets, blanket, pillow, towel, soap, and shampoo. These become the property of the dorm resident, and we encourage you to take them with you at the end of the Championships.

Late Arrivals

Those teams staying in the Southwestern University residence halls arriving outside of the designated registration window should contact James Duffy ((512) 423-1855) or Jonathan Rains ((301) 529-3449) upon arrival at the University.

Check-Out

All key cards and physical keys must be returned to Southwestern University staff upon departure. A table will be set up in Bishops Lounge on the morning of July 8 for return of keys. Those departing before that time should contact James Duffy or Jonathan Rains to arrange a check-out time.

Air Transportation

Austin-Bergstrom International Airport (IATA code: AUS, ICAO code: KAUS) offers direct flights from all major cities in the United States and also offers convenient direct international service from Toronto, London, Frankfurt, and Amsterdam. Alternatively, participants may choose to fly to Dallas/Fort Worth International Airport (IATA: DFW, 185 miles/300 km away, 3 hours driving time) or Houston George Bush Intercontinental Airport (IATA: IAH, 180 miles/290 km away, 3.5 hours driving time). Driving time from the Austin airport to the housing site at Southwestern University is approximately 45 minutes.

Ground Transportation

Texas is *big*. Teams should take great care to consider their transportation needs carefully, as public transport options are not available for the distances participants will need to cover each day. Depending on the size of their group, teams are encouraged to rent cars, vans, or buses. For those unable to secure rental vehicles, the organizers have arranged for buses to transport a *limited* number of competitors from the dorms at Southwestern to the flying field at Apache Pass each day. Only 60 participants each day will be able to use this option!

We strongly encourage larger teams to arrange their own local transportation. Smaller teams should consider renting cars or vans, while larger teams may wish to secure coach-style bus transport. Please contact these firms directly, as the organizers are not able to assist with securing rented or contracted car, bus, or van services.

Weather

Temperatures in central Texas during early July are hot, but manageable. Expect highs each day to be around 93°F (34C), with lows overnight at 76°F (24C). Rain is rare during July, and the winds during the summer are typically from the south-southeast. It is recommended that participants wear light colored clothing and hats to help manage the heat, and to use sunscreen. Proper hydration is critical, so plenty of water and ice will be on hand to help participants stay cool.
